Competition Rules in Brief

1. To enter participants must be 30 years of age or under at 31 December 2010, currently working full time in the wine industry for at least 3 years in a hands on, practical position in the region in which they are entering the competition.
 2. To enter the competition participants must be a New Zealand citizen or hold a current New Zealand residency permit.
 3. Regional Competitions will be held in Hawkes Bay, Marlborough and Central Otago. The winner of each Regional Competition will compete in the Markhams Young Viticulturist of the Year 2010 National Competition held in conjunction with the Romeo Bragato Conference, Blenheim, August 2010.
 4. Those who qualify to enter but live or work outside the regions where competitions are being held may enter the National Competition in one of two ways:
 - Enter another regions competition.
 - To qualify for entry in the National Competition, that person must be placed in the top four in the regional competition.
 - Where two or more contestants are from the same outside region and placed in the top four, the highest place getter will qualify.
 - An entrant who has qualified to enter the National Competition via a Regional Competition is entitled to financial support for travel and accommodation to the National Competition.
- Or
- Direct entry to the National Competition with the support of their regional association.
 - Application for entry may be made to the National Competition Director in writing, and should include a brief history of the competitor outlining work history, experience and any relevant qualifications. This should be supported by a letter from the President of the Regional Association.
 - There is no financial support for this type of entrant to attend the National Competition.
 - Only one entrant from each outside region may enter the National Competition.
